## Academic Break Policy – Langley Flying School Students

To support student well-being and provide time for rest, travel, or personal study, Langley Flying School observes an annual Academic Break.

#### 1. Break Period

• December 15 to January 5 each year is designated as the Academic Break.

#### 2. Ground School

- No ground school classes will be scheduled during the break period.
- Administrative offices will be available on a limited basis for urgent matters only.

## 3. Flight Training

- Flying during the break is optional.
- Students may choose to continue flight training if they wish, subject to instructor and aircraft availability.
- Students who prefer not to fly during this period may pause their training without penalty.

#### 4. Bookings & Cancellations

- Students who want to fly during the break must book lessons in advance through the usual scheduling system.
- Normal cancellation policies still apply for booked flights during the break.

#### 5. Administrative Notes

- Instructors' availability may be reduced during the break; priority scheduling is first-come, first-served.
- Students should ensure their Transport Canada documents, visa status, or medicals remain valid if planning extended travel during this time.

## 6. Support During Break

- The Learning Support Coordinator and Program Assistance staff will respond to emails periodically but may have limited office hours.
- Emergency contacts (see Critical Incident & Crisis Management Policy) remain in effect.

#### **Tip for Students:**

Use the Academic Break for rest, review, or catching up on self-study. If you plan to travel internationally, check visa and entry requirements well in advance.
